

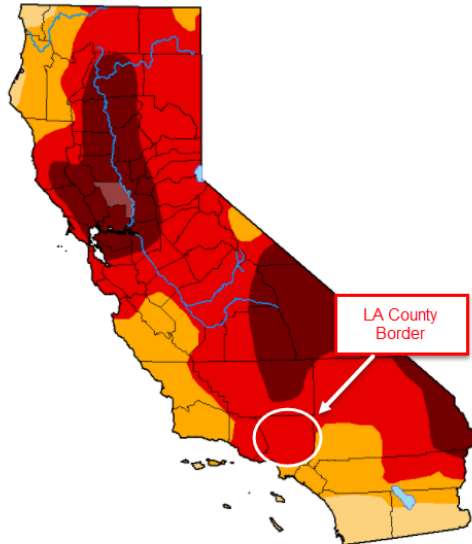

California

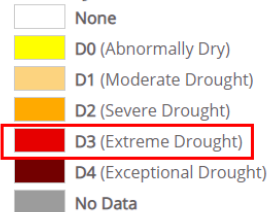
